

Consignment Information:

- Only members whose membership dues have been paid by January 31 of the year of the sale may consign Boer goats to the sale.
- Consignment fees are \$30.00/per goat and are non-refundable. Sales commission will be charged and will be based on expenses generated by the sale. This commission will not exceed 10% of the sale price of the goat.
- Substitutions are seriously discouraged. Substitutions made by consignors after August 15, of the year of the sale will result in an additional \$10 fee.
- Initial consignment dates are April 1 to July 15, 2014. During this period, each member farm may consign from 1 to 8 Boer goats to the sale.
- After July 15th of the year of the sale, if the maximum goal of 100 goats has not been reached, members may consign additional Boer goats until the sale is full or until August 1, 2014.
- Consignments are not considered 'reserved' until consignment form is completed and fees are paid in full.
- Photos, pedigree information and descriptions for consigned goats must be provided to Production Sale Secretary by August 1st of the sale year.
- The catalog will be maintained on the boergoats.com site and available for National viewing as well as local viewing.
- Member farms consigning a minimum of 3 does may also consign 1 buck. No farm can consign more than 1 buck to the sale.
- Consigned does and bucks must be registered or a registration form provided so the new buyer can register them.
- Sellers will determine their own minimum floor price and their own reserve if desired. The sale minimum, if the seller does not assign one, will be \$200.00. The sale commission will be charged on the floor price if the animal is not sold.
- All consigned goats should be presented well groomed and in good health. Goats who exhibit signs of illness or a communicable condition will be pulled from the sale.
- Number of goats per pen in barns would be limited to 2.
- Goats brought for delivery from outside sales would not be allowed in sales barns.
- All consigned goats must arrive at the sale location with necessary documents. These documents are:
 - the original registration dated and signed on the back by the registered owner.
 - if the goat is not already registered, the completed registration form so the goat can be registered by the buyer, signed and dated.
 - If a doe is being sold 'bred' or 'exposed' that must be noted properly on the back of the registration form or a completed and signed service memo must be provided.
